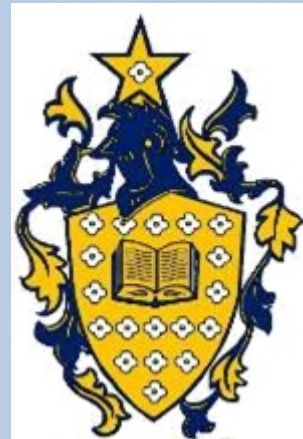




Congratulations to our WIS Hockey Team coming 2nd in a well fought final. They played with great courage and commitment. Well done!
