SCHOOL DONATION

The Government has offered schools who are eligible, funding of \$150.00 per student in lieu of school donations. The Fairfield Intermediate Board of Trustees have once again accepted this funding for the 2025 school year.

TECHNOLOGY AND ARTS PROGRAMME DONATION

The Fairfield Intermediate Technology Programme provides opportunities for our students in the area of technology and the arts. During the year, students will have the opportunity to take part in seven of the eight subjects offered.

If you would like to pay for the take home components, please complete payment for these by Friday 14 March, although we will accept payment after this date. You are also welcome to set up an automatic payment. The school bank account number is ASB 12-3171-0206429-00, please ensure you put the student's name as our reference.

If you do not wish to purchase the take home components, please contact our Finance Officer, Mrs Shamima Mohammed, on 07 855 9718 ext 843 or email accounts@fairfieldintermediate.school.nz to have it removed from your account. Please be assured that your child will not be excluded from participating in the technology and arts programme should you decide not to purchase the take home components, as we wish to be inclusive of all students.

ICT MATTERS

We have a significant investment in IT infrastructure, along with many students bringing their own devices to school. All students will be asked to sign a User Agreement after being taken through it with their class teacher. They will be coming home over the next couple of days.

Device Insurance – Please check that your insurance covers your child's device. The school does not provide cover of any kind. During school hours only all devices will have an anti-virus cover, however there are lots of free on-line anti-virus applications if you wish to load these on to your child's device.

Fairfield Intermediate is a BYOD school (Bring Your Own Device). This means that all students are able to bring their own device to school daily. We suggest laptops or chromebooks over tablets, however, these are still an option if nothing else is available. If your child does not own a device, there are a limited number of laptops and chromebooks that can be borrowed from the school for use at school. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any queries concerning this.

LOST PROPERTY

We have many items of lost property every year, all unnamed. Named property is returned to the student's classroom. Please make sure that all clothing, in particular, is named so it can be returned. Lost property will be kept outside the Student Centre each day.

ENTERING THE SCHOOL GROUNDS

We have an open-door policy, however our Health and Safety Regulations require that if you are visiting our school you must sign in first at Reception. Please do this to ensure that in the case of an emergency everyone on our school grounds is accounted for. Thank you.

NEWSLETTERS

In 2025, our newsletter will normally be emailed every second Friday. There is a lot of information in this newsletter which will be placed on our school website www.fairfieldintermediate.school.nz each week and also sent out via Skool Loop. Please keep your newsletters to refer back to and, in particular, this week's cover page with important information for the year. In addition, please follow the school's Facebook page as this has regular updates.

DAILY STUDENT NOTICES

These are published every morning at 9.00 am and are posted in all classrooms for students to check so that they are informed of any events/news happening on the day and upcoming events. These are also put on the school website for parents to check on a daily basis and sent out via Skool Loop.

SKOOL LOOP

Our school uses an online app called Skool Loop. Through this app you will be able to send your absentees via phone, email or text, access the calendar and receive newsletters. School notices can be sent directly to this app from the school and you will receive notifications. This app is completely free to download and we are recommending that all parents please download this to their smartphone. This can be done via your app store – search Skool Loop – download app – once downloaded open the app and select New Zealand – Hamilton – Fairfield Intermediate School. The app will instantly become active. The Skool Loop App is another alternative to the school website, Facebook, newsletters, emails, etc., using today technology to reach out to the school community.



STATIONERY

Thank you to all those who have purchased stationery already. From Wednesday 29 January the normal stationery sales times are before school from 8.00 am until 8.45 am each morning (i.e., before the school bell rings to start the day) from the Student Centre. These times are standard for stationery sales throughout the year. Eftpos facilities are available although credit card payments are not.

CYCLING TO SCHOOL/SCOOTERS

Cycling is a great way to get to school but it is important to ride with courtesy and respect for all other cyclists and motorists. Make sure you are visible at all times and clearly show your intentions. Think of other road users when you can, for example, let them know you are happy they waited for you by waving, smiling, or giving them a 'thumbs up'.

This will make sharing the road easier for everyone. Ensure you know the road code regarding cycling and always wear your helmet and lock your bike. No bikes or scooters are to be ridden in school grounds. Scooters are stored in the classroom cloakbays and bikes are stored next to the auditorium during school hours.

UNIFORM

The correct school uniform is required to be worn at all times during the school day. Please note however that the Fairfield Intermediate hoodies purchased for sports or cultural activities are not part of the correct school uniform. They can be worn at camp or on out-of-school organised sports days but not during normal school hours.

Jewellery – Only the following may be worn:

- Single small gold or silver stud in each ear lobe.
- One wrist watch.
- One plain light chain or bone carving that has cultural or religious significance only.

Please note that the uniform includes black leather shoes, not canvas shoes during Terms 2 and 3, and black Roman sandals or similar style during Terms 1 and 4. Students do have the option to wear shoes or sandals all year if they wish to.

<u>School caps/hats are strongly reccommended and we encourage that these are worn</u> during interval and lunch breaks when the students are outside. The caps and hats can be purchased from NZ Uniforms or from the school office.

We would also like to remind you that make-up is not to be worn at school (this includes nail polish) and that plain hair ties or head bands (blue, yellow, white or black) only are to be worn. Students are also to have natural hair colour and long hair is to be tied back. False lashes and nails are also not acceptable. Mufti gear is not to be worn with the uniform (e.g., mufti beanies, coloured tops under school shirts, etc). Please see our school prospectus for more detailed information regarding uniform.

If your child requires a temporary uniform pass for a valid reason, they need to see the Student Pastoral Dean, Mr Grant Edwards. If your child is wearing the incorrect uniform, a letter will be sent home informing parents/caregivers and we will require your child to be in correct uniform from then on.

EDUCATION AND IMMUNISATION DATES FOR PARENTS

The Public Health Nurse will be at the school for immunisation education and giving out of consent forms on 3 February 2025. If you do not wish your child to attend the education session, please let the school know.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

PLEASE NOTE - In all cases a valid reason must be given for the absence or it will be noted as unjustified.

It is also important that if your child is late, i.e., arriving to school after the morning bell has rung, they must sign in at the Student Centre. They must do this, even if you have phoned the school to explain that they will be late.

We use a text messaging service. In the first instance, where we have been given cellphone numbers, we will text a caregiver if your child is not at school. Please immediately reply to this text or phone the school on 855 9718 to explain the reason for your child's absence.

BUS BAY – FRONT OF SCHOOL PARKING

Please do not park in the bus bay at the front of school. We need to keep our children safe and the bus bay area needs to be kept clear for school buses.



You are reminded that the speed limit is 40 km/h outside schools, this speed limit is indicated with the flashing school zone speed signs. We would, however, urge you to keep your speed down on Clarkin Road at all times.

The bottom gate, coming in by the wharenui, is for emergency and special access vehicles only. Do not drive in or drop students off in this driveway.

We also ask that if you are collecting children from school, especially on Clarkin Road, that you make arrangements for them to walk down the road to meet you. With Fairfield Primary finishing earlier than us it is always busy at the front of school from 2.30 pm onwards. The staff car park area, which is clearly marked, is not to be used as a drop off and pick up area. Thank you.

Please also refrain from driving cars in the Kensington Place gate driveway in the mornings or afternoons, unless you are going to the dentist. If you are parking for the dentist, you need to turn right as you drive down the driveway. We now have several school transport vans and cars bringing students to school. They need to have access priority and plenty of room to turn and drop children off safely. Thank you for your understanding and co-operation. We also have a large number of students who exit through this gate and cars in the driveway becomes a health and safety issue

<u>CHANGES TO DETAILS – ADDRESS – PHONE – CELLPHONES – EMAIL</u>

Please ensure that all changes of address, phone numbers, cellphone numbers and email addresses are kept up-to-date with the school. This is particularly important, when we are trying to contact parents/caregivers in cases of sick students at school. Thank you for your assistance with this.

We have already started sending out emails to parents and caregivers. If you have given us your email address but do not seem to be receiving any emails, please contact the school office to ensure we have your correct email address on our records.

MONEY / CELLPHONES AT SCHOOL

If your child needs to bring money to school for use after school, please ensure that they hand it into their classroom teacher who will look after it for the day by placing it in a lockable cupboard and returning it at 2.55 pm. Cellphones are not to be used at school during school time or any time on the school grounds. If your child must bring a cellphone to school for after school use this must also be handed into the classroom teacher for safe keeping. <u>The school will not be held</u> <u>responsible for any cellphones that go missing on school premises.</u>

Please place any money for school costs into an envelope and clearly write your child's name, room number and what the payment is for on the outside of the envelope. Your child is to then put the envelope in the drop box located in the Student Centre. Receipts will be issued to your child over the next day or two.

SPORTS 2025

Welcome to another year of sport at Fairfield Intermediate School. The year is shaping up to be a big one for sport so please encourage your children to get involved! In order for teams to be registered in out-of-school competitions, we require fees to be paid by the cut off date and coaches and managers for each team. Without your support, teams will not be registered and therefore your children will miss out on being involved in out-of-school sports. We also have a parents', and players' code of conduct for sport in 2025. This is located on our school website. Please ensure you have read this alongside your child prior to submitting your registration. Registration forms are sent digitally to parents' emails as a Google form, alternatively students can collect a hard copy registration form from the Student Centre. Until the end of April, the government's Community Connect scheme means that those aged 5– 12 years old get free travel and those aged between 13 and 25 half price with their own registered Bee Card.

1. Scan the QR code on the bus.

3. Set up an auto top up- so that way you never have to worry about if you have enough money on your card.

4. Download the transit app (https://busit.co.nz/travelling-with-us/transit-app/). The app will tell you how far away the bus is and help you plan your journey.
